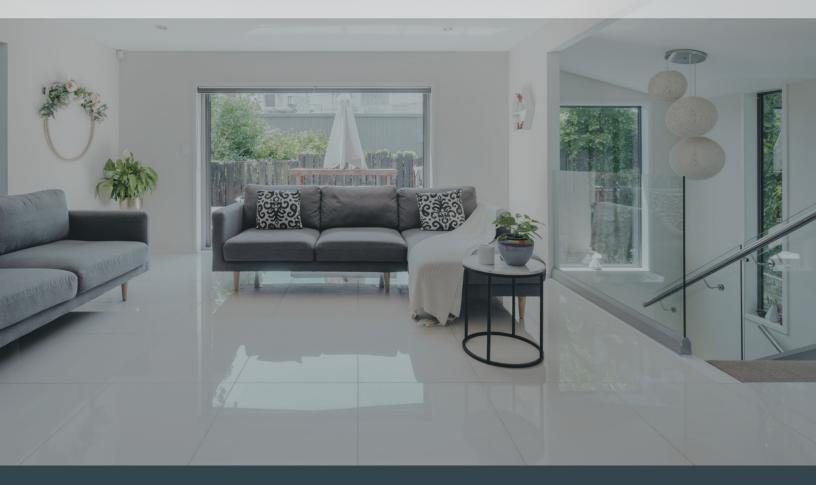

- Go through every room and get rid of anything you no longer want or need
- Declutter and depersonalize *everything*! Small objects don't photo well so remove any knick-knacks and any personal items. When it comes to getting your home ready for the market, less is ALWAYS more
- Remove personal photos & portraits
- Take down trophies, awards, and framed certificates
- Pack away toys, kids' artwork, sports equipment, and pet supplies
- Depersonalize bathrooms by removing or storing toothbrushes, makeup, hair products, etc.
- Deep clean the entire home top-to-bottom as you've never cleaned before

EASY, LOW-COST UPGRADES

HERE ARE A FEW LOW-COST UPGRADES THAT WILL MAKE A BIG IMPACT IN THE EYES OF POTENTIAL BUYERS:

REPAINT/CLEAN WALLS:

Replace bold or outdated wall colors with soft neutral colors, and touch up kitchen baseboards, cabinets, trim, doors, and moulding. Using light shades of blue or gray has been shown to be more appealing to potential buyers.

LANDSCAPE:

Refreshing your landscaping is highly important for curb appeal. Your exterior Is your first impression to potential buyers. Add some color with flowers and shrubs, remove weeds, and keep the lawn mowed.

UPGRADE LIGHTING & FIXTURES:

Lighten up any dark rooms by adding lamps and accent lighting, and be sure to swap old light bulbs with brighter LED bulbs. Also swap out old, outdated light fixtures and doorknobs with new, modern fixtures to Instantly transform a space.

REPLACE OUTDATED APPLIANCES:

Outdated appliances can make the home feel older and unappealing to buyers. Updating your old black or white appliances with stainless steel options can add a lot of value to your home.

UPDATE FLOORING:

Flooring is one of the first things a potential buyer will see and can make or break it for them. Replace old carpeting and get your wood floors polished and your tile floors cleaned, including the grout.

DIY STAGING TIPS





Open all of the blinds and remove all curtains

Add new fluffy white towels to all of the bathrooms

Remove all area rugs (unless discussed)

Replace any brass fixtures and hardware with brushed nickel or black matte- I can recommend new chic, inexpensive lighting fixtures and hardware

Remove air freshners. Clean Is the best scent - deep clean like you've never cleaned before, including the stove, fridge, and microwave

Clean out and organize All closets- this will help the storage space appear larger

De-clutter everything – Have a designated basket you can use for random things lying around and then take it with you when you leave! Put toiletries away and remove clutter from countertops.

De-personalize your home – One of the primary objectives of home staging is to help prospective buyers visualize the space as their own (also for security reasons). Take down any photos of you or your family and store in the back of your closet

Buy a new welcome mat for the front door.

Add white or neutral bedding, with more pillows. Give your bedrooms a facelift. and create a more inviting space.

Dust your baseboards, door frames and windowsills. Use a Magic Eraser If necessary on stubborn stains.

CLEANING IS ESSENTIAL

- Consider hiring a professional cleaning company to thoroughly clean your home from top to bottom
- · Have your rugs and carpets steam cleaned or replaced
- Deep clean all appliances
- Replace old caulk and remove all stains from tubs, toilets, and sinks
- Wipe down all surfaces
- Power wash the front and back patio or deck
- Clean all windows, inside and out
- Clean gutters & downspouts
- Clean out kitchen cabinets & pantry, and remove everything from countertops
- Remove excess or bulky furniture that can get in the way of buyers walking through the home
- Declutter your closet space so you can showcase how much room there is for storage
